1. Venue

The Queensland State Aerobatic Championships will be held at the Watts Bridge Memorial Airfield, from Thursday 22nd August to Saturday 24th August 2024 inclusive.

7. Briefing

All Contestants must check-in and confirm registration by **1600 (4pm) on Wednesday 21st** August and are to attend the Initial Competition Pilot and Judges Briefing at 1700 (5pm) on Wednesday 21st August.

Along with this Wednesday afternoon Initial Briefing, there will be Competition Briefings held at 0800 hours on Competition Mornings and a debrief, if required for safety, at the completion of each day's flying.

Competitors who fail to attend the competition briefings/debriefings may be disqualified for that day's flight.

8. Contest Rules

The contest will be conducted according to the rules of the Australian Aerobatic Club.

FAI Rules will govern Unlimited, Advanced and Intermediate category competition with the exception of the height limits for Intermediate.

All pilots can expect to be requested to judge categories they are not competing in.

Variations to AAC Rules:

2.14.2: Change to "The AACQLD committee will determine any appropriate expenses to be reimbursed to contest officials."

2.14.3 Change to "The AACQLD committee will determine any appropriate expenses to be reimbursed to judges."

2.15.5 Will not be enforced though it is highly recommended that CIVA pilots are current with Judging.

2.16 Safety Pilot will be allowed as per AAC Rules 2.16 and 2.17.

2.23.1(c): Change to "Free or free known sequences as a ".seq" file from Open Aero on a USB Stick, or via email to the QLD Contest Secretary and Chief Judge / Chief Scorer if not uploaded to the AAC website prior"

2.26.3: add "b) Contestants arriving later due force majeure may be permitted, by the Contest Jury, to fly in the contest"

2.33.1(a): Change to "Protests must be lodged not later than three (3) hours after the Chief Scorer issues the last of the pertinent raw-score results. Non-working hours will be counted."

2.39.2 (r): Change to "Alteration of Free Programme. After the Initial Comp Brief day before competition start a free / free known sequence cannot be changed. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the contest committee have the correct free / free known before start of the competition, if there have been any changes after initial forwarding to the contest committee."

2.54.1 to 2.54.5: There will be no line judges.

2.59.2: Add "Entry and Graduate pilots may elect to do a continuous roll instead of the half roll to inverted and half roll to upright."

2.63: Change to "Sportsman – Unknown & Intermediate – Free Known 1"

2.63.2: Change to "All figures for the Sportsman Unknown sequence will be selected from Appendix 2-3 of this manual. The sequence will contain a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 12 figures, with an aggregate K factor of up to 120."

2.63.3: Change to "The Intermediate free unknown figure selection and sequence creation will be conducted in accordance with FAI Sporting Code, Section 6 Intermediate Free Unknown 2. Refer 2.65 for exceptions to these rules.

2.64: Change to "Sportsman – Known 1 repeat or free & Intermediate – Free Known 2"

2.64.2: Change to "Sportsman competitors have the option of re-flying the known sequence in lieu of a free designed in accordance with table 2.63.1 and table 2.63.2 below for Programme 2 and rules 2.63.4 – 2.63.11.

2.64.3: Change to "The Intermediate free unknown figure selection and sequence creation will be conducted in accordance with FAI Sporting Code, Section 6 Intermediate Free Unknown 3. Refer 2.65 for exceptions to these rules."

2.65: Add: "The Advanced and Unlimited free unknown 1 figure selection creation will be conducted in accordance with FAI Sporting Code, Section 6 Free Unknown 2. Refer 2.65 for exceptions to these rules."

Add: "The Advanced and Unlimited free unknown 2 figure selection creation will be conducted in accordance with FAI Sporting Code, Section 6 Free Unknown 3. Refer 2.65 for exceptions to these rules."

Appendix 2-1: Criteria for Judging Aerobatic Figures will be replaced with the current FAI Section 6 2023 criteria with the exception for the criteria for judging the "Wing Over" and "Barrel Roll" where AAC Rules will apply.

9. Practice

The AACQLD supervised practice day is Wednesday 21 July, and a briefing will be held at 0800 hours on that day. Competitors who arrive after the briefing will not be permitted to practice until they have been briefed by either the Contest Director, Chief Judge or Safety Officer.

Practice on Wednesday will end at 1630 (4:30pm) so as pilots will be available for Initial Competition Briefing.

A Notam will be issued for operations in the aerobatic box per CASA EX81/21, commencing on Sunday 18 August and running throughout the Championships.

Competitors wishing to practice with ground critique or in the vicinity of the Watts Bridge airfield prior to the first briefing on the Wednesday must advise <u>contestsecretary@aacqld.com.au</u> and must also comply with the requirements of CASA EX81/21, particularly having two people on the ground performing communication duties.

Before Sunday there will be no Notam in place and thus no exemptions **are available** for low level ops in the circuit area and being off CTAF frequency. Therefore, the minimum height for these practices is 2,300 ft AMSL, and the CTAF frequency must be monitored by the pilot in command.

After 1630 on Wednesday 21 August 2024, competitors will not be permitted to fly other than during the competition or as per competition rules.

10. Fuel and Oil

Watts Bridge airfield has a fuel bowser that requires a Compac Pay app to purchase fuel. Refer to <u>https://wattsbridge.com.au/wp-</u> <u>content/uploads/compac_app_instructions.pdf</u> for further information

It is preferred that you bring sufficient oil for your aircraft. If this is not possible, please contact the Competition Secretary of your requirements and we will endeavour to assist.

11 Hangarage

Limited hangarage is available. Please complete the Hangarage form on the web site. Hangarage fees will be \$15.00 per night per aircraft and is payable with the other fees. Please note this is on a "first come first served" basis.

If you are planning on attending the Pacific Airshow and would like to bring your plane up the week before, please put this in comments along with the date and also notify the Contest Secretary and we will do our best to arrange early hangarage.
